

THESE ARE THE FACTS!!!!!

There is the greatest likelihood for a vehicle to be stolen from the following station districts:

- Arouca
- Chaguanas (Mid Centre & Centre City Mall)
 - San Fernando (Gulf City Mall)
 - St. Joseph
 - St. James

THESE ARE THE FACTS!!!!!

- ·Expensive vehicles are less likely to be stolen
- ·The closer you are to a shopping area increases the likelihood of vehicle theft
- ·Criminals prefer Nissan vehicles (B11,12,13,14 &15)
- ·The safer Divisions are the Eastern, Tobago & South Western Divisions
- ·Criminals usually prefer white vehicles, silver/grey & blue
- ·Fridays, Saturdays & Sundays most vehicles are stolen
- ·Most vehicles have been stolen between 4:00 p.m. & 12:00 midnight
- Persons are more likely to have their vehicle stolen when parked along a street/road or parked in a parking lot
- ·You lose your vehicle shortly after it was parked
- ·Criminals like to target the malls/large parking lots
- Larceny/Robbery of motor vehicles is decreasing in prevalent areas
- There does not appear to be a month of the year trend, but February recorded the most reports & December the least
- 87 vehicles between \$1,000 & 5,000 have been stolen between 1/1/2004 & 30/11/2009

WHAT CAN I DO?

- Lock doors & windows & properly secure your vehicle
- ·Lock steering wheel/brake pedal
- ·Obtain an immobilizer
- Install a Car Alarm
- Install a killswitch
- ·Signage on windows
- Install Vehicle Tracking System
- ·Park in well lit areas
- ·Lock garage door
- VIN Etching
- Avoid leaving valuables in vehicle
- ·Be aware of surroundings
- ·Avoid purchasing common vehicles
- Paint your vehicle in an unusual colour
- ·Avoid parking lots that do not provide security/attendants on duty
- Avoid areas where criminals are known to frequent
- If possible purchase high-priced vehicles
- Take your key out of the ignition when you disembark
- Modify your vehicle for easy identification
- Start a neighbourhood watch in your area
